

Regulations for the Association for the European Intuitive Music Conference

Passed at general assembly at Rudme Friskole, August 4 1996. Amended at general assembly at Rudme Friskole, August 13 2000. Amended at general assembly at Svendborg Musikskole, August 20, 2006. Amended 2017 by the committee after former Polish committee members agreed to leave the organisation and passed at the general assembly 4 August 2018 in Gent, Belgium. Amended at the general assembly at Basel, 5 July 2024, and now called *Regulations for the Association for the European Intuitive Music Conference*.

1. The aim of the Association is to arrange a meeting for improvising musicians and related concerts, called *European Intuitive Music Conference (EIMC)*. If possible, this is to be done every year.
2. Members are the participants of the current edition of the conference including its committee.
3. The Association is managed by a committee, including a cashier, elected by the members at the general assembly, held during the previous edition of the EIMC.
4. The association has an Advisory Board consisting of at least two members who have participated in the conferences more often and who have a broad network in the field of improvised music. Their task is to provide feedback on the ideas of the committee organising the current conference. At present, the board consists of Carl Bergstrøm-Nielsen and Roman Stolyar.
5. The current members of the Association will elect a new committee to organise the next Conference and to manage the Association from the end of the current edition of the Conference until the end of the next one. At least one member of the current committee has to be member of the new one.
6. The Association can only be held economically responsible with its own fortune. No claims can be made against individual members or members of its committee.
7. The committee of the Association arranges a general assembly during an edition of the conference. Those present decide by simple majority of votes. However, amendments of regulations require that two thirds of the total number of members present vote for them on two consecutive general assemblies, unless there is unanimity in the committee. If this is the case, decision can take place by simple majority of votes at one assembly. No proxy voting is allowed.
8. At the General Assembly, the committee accounts for the organisation of the current conference and for the policies and finances pursued.
